Environmental Study Team at Work: Some members of the Fort Plain Environmental Study Team spent time this summer excavating along the Erie Canal lock in Fort Plain. They joined students from across the county and state, to begin an archeological exploration of the former Erie Canal lock off Hancock Street in the village. Archeologist Zach McKeeby, of the Schoharie River Center, led the students in excavation work, followed by cleaning and analyzing their findings, before presenting those findings to the public. Student groups were each assigned a one meter by one meter plot, carefully digging in horizontal levels about 10 centimenters deep at a time. As each layer was uncovered, the students discovered items - including a glass button, bottle caps, a pipe stem, copper gaskets, mechanical gears, ballast rocks, and a pipe decorated with an American Eagle design. Some of the students participating in the archeology project included: Bruce Thibodeau, Patrick Murphy, Mackenzie Wintermute, and Willow McGinnis.

Baseball Players Earn All-Star Honors: At the close of the school year, the New York State Sportswriters Assocation released its 2017 All-State Baseball Teams. Drew Fureno was the only local player to earn First Team honors. Drew is a catcher, shortstop and pitcher. He finished the season batting .368, with 29 stolen bases and 16 runs batted in. Pitching this season, for the first time since 7th grade, Fureno worked to a 1.96 ERA with 32 strikeouts in 25 innings. He will continue his baseball career by playing for LeMoyne College this fall. Selected to the Fourth Team was sophomore Bryce Thibodeau. As a first baseman and pitcher, Bryce hit .400 with 2 home runs and 27 runs batted in. He went 6-2 on the mound, with a 2.33 ERA. Thibodeau will return to lead the Hilltoppers this spring as junior.

District Receives Walmart Grant:

A \$2,000 grant from Walmart will fund "Smarter Social Studies" and create a resource library of more than 120 new books, to be used by seventh grade students this school year. The books will be selected to especially help students with their studies of early American history.

Emory Sammons: Team USA, Takes on Worlds:

Seventeen-year old Emory Sammons, a senior at the Fort Plain High School, represented Team USA at the 2017 World Rowing Junior Championships in Traka, Lithuania. Sammons and the three other members of his Quadruple Sculls Team won the B Final and finished No. 7 in the world. Switzerland won the event overall. Sammons earned a place on the United States National Team after winning at the NYS Scholastic Rowing Association State Championships, and then winning at the Scholastic Rowing Association of America National Championships. Sammons is a member of the Saratoga Rowing Association.

Back to School: Medication Policy

In order for the school nurses to administer medication, including even non-prescription medications such as Tylenol and cough drops, families must note the following information: All medications must be delivered to the school nurse in the original container from the store or pharmacy. Medications may not be sent in with students. Written parental permission to administer over-the-counter medication must be current and on file. A physician's order must be on file in order to administer prescription medications. The physician's order must include the name of the medication, dosage amount, and frequency to be given. Back to School: Attendance Procedures

Parents are reminded to send in a written excuse each time a child is absent. The note should include the date of the absence, the reason for the absence, and a parental signature. If a child is (or will be) absent from school for two days or more, homework may be requested. Phone calls requesting homework should be made first thing in the morning, to allow time for teachers to gather work to send down at the end of the day. Students arriving late must report to the reception kiosk for a pass. When possible, they should have a written excuse for being tardy. If a child needs to be picked up early from school, a note should be sent in that morning outlining who will be picking the student up and at what time. Elementary school students who are being picked up during the course of the school day may not leave the building on their own. The child must be signed out by the authorized adult, and the receptionist will call them out of class at that time. Please call the main offices of either building with any questions about attendance procedures.
